Professor Malcolm Reed

“What is new in Medical Education?”



Professor Reed qualified in medicine from the University of Sheffield in 1981. Following postgraduate surgical training in the UK and a period of research at the University of Louisville in Kentucky, he returned to Sheffield for Higher Surgical Training. He became Senior Lecturer and Honorary Consultant in 1992 and was appointed to the Foundation Chair in Surgical Oncology at the University of Sheffield in 1999.

Professor Reed has a long-standing track record in cancer research, with more than 200 publications. His main areas of clinical research relate to the surgical management of breast cancer, with particular emphasis on breast cancer in older women.

Professor Reed took up the appointment of Dean of BSMS in December 2014. In his talk he will be exploring the issues in medical education to ensure we graduate doctors equipped for the challenges of future medical practice and reflecting on his first 18 months at BSMS.
