“Aortic Surgery – Has much changed?”
Syed Waqar Yusuf MB BS, DM, FRCS

Mr Yusuf trained in Nottingham and Perth, and joined BSUH in 2002. He introduced endovascular aortic surgery and carotid surgery under local anaesthesia to Sussex and helped develop the regional vascular service. He played a pioneering role in the development of endovascular aortic aneurysm repair, and performed the first endovascular repair of a ruptured aneurysm in the world in 1994. Despite dealing with the most complex aortic cases, he has maintained one of the best outcomes for aortic aneurysm surgery in the UK. He was a Hunterian Professor of the Royal College of Surgeons in 1999 and a visiting Professor University of Texas Houston USA in 2006. He has edited some of the early books and has over 80 publications on Vascular and Endovascular surgery. He has served as the Tutor in Vascular Surgery (2006-2009) at the Royal College of Surgeons of England, Director of Vascular & Endovascular Courses at the RCS, Member Court of Examiners RCS, Professional Affairs Board (South East) and Appointments advisory committee of the Royal College of Surgeons of England. He is a Past chairman of the British Medical Association Brighton division. He was a Member of the Training and Education Committee and ex officio member of Council of the Vascular Society of Great Britain and Ireland (2006 – 2009) and Vascular Advisor South East Thames 2010 – 2011. He served on the first SAC in Vascular Surgery (2012-17) and is a current member of the national selection board for General & Vascular surgery. He is an elected member of the Council of the Vascular Society of Great Britain. He is an honorary Reader and the module lead for Surgery for BSMS.
