“The Anatomy of Courage”



Dr Tony Eisinger studied for a Natural Sciences Tripos at Trinity College, Cambridge. By a slightly roundabout route he ended up studying medicine at the Middlesex Hospital! Having trained as a Nephrologist he became Director of the Southwest Thames Renal and Transplantation Unit and stayed there for more than thirty years. He was closely associated with The Royal College of Physicians as a Regional Adviser, Council Member and MRCP Examiner for 25 years.

His Arts and Classics training at School always gave him an interest in literature and history and his great love of music has led him to his current study into some of the health aspects of the composer, Franz Schubert. This illustrated talk is about Lord Moran, Churchill's physician, who won the Military Cross at the Battle of the Somme and described the experiences of infantrymen's reaction to the terrors of battle in his important book - "The Anatomy Of Courage"
